

Southwest Clinical Campus Librarian

The Harley E. French Library of the Health Sciences is recruiting for the Southwest Clinical Campus librarian. We are looking for outgoing applicants who can be flexible in a changing environment. This position has two components: outreach for the medical and health programs of UND, and assistant librarian for the Medcenter One (MCO) Health Library in Bismarck. The librarian is located on the southwest campus in Bismarck, and reports to the director of libraries for the UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences (SMHS) on the main campus in Grand Forks.

Outreach responsibilities for UND include:

- provide library user education services to SMHS faculty, residents, and students on the SW campus in Bismarck, including curriculum-related bibliographic and information retrieval instruction
- develop and deliver library outreach services to SMHS clinical faculty and students, and to UND College of Nursing students and faculty in the SW quadrant of the state
- develop and deliver library outreach services to non-affiliated health professionals in the SW quadrant, including instruction in locating and effectively utilizing information resources for patient care
- promote the use of library and electronic resources to health consumers through partnerships with public libraries, community-based organizations, and other organizations
- assist in developing content for the website of the Library of the Health Sciences

Responsibilities for MCO Health Library include:

- provide reference and information services to clientele of the MCO Health Library, including literature searching and reference assistance
- assist in managing circulation services, acquisitions, maintenance of the print and electronic collections, and cataloging

Required qualifications: Master's degree from an ALA-accredited program; two years professional library experience; demonstrated teaching ability and knowledge of instructional design; knowledge of information literacy concepts; strong working knowledge of computer and information technology; effective interpersonal and communication skills.

Preferred qualifications: experience in a health sciences or academic library; knowledge of health information resources; strong database searching skills; academic background in one of the life sciences; knowledge of the principles of evidence-based healthcare; experience with providing outreach and liaison services to affiliated and unaffiliated users.

About Bismarck: The capital city of Bismarck is on the Missouri Plateau and borders the Missouri River. Nearby is Lake Sakakawea, a reservoir lake formed by the Garrison Dam and a huge recreational area for fishing, boating and water sports.
