Creative Commons defines the spectrum of possibilities between full copyright — *all rights reserved* — and the public domain — *no rights reserved*. The "creative commons" licenses help you keep your copyright while inviting certain uses of your work — a "some rights reserved" copyright.

The **ProQuest Dissertations and Theses database**, searchable from the library web site, includes University of North Dakota dissertations submitted in their entirety from 1995 to the present. All other dissertations include the abstract and first 25 pages of the document and must be purchased by the user to view the full dissertation.
