### ***Helpful Resources***

#### AccessMedicine

- A collection of full-text medical reference books, a differential diagnosis tool, drug information, practice guidelines, patient handouts, and A/V content.
- *Books include:*
  - Basic & Clinical Pharmacology
  - Harrison’s Principles of Internal Medicine
  - Junqueira’s Basic Histology
  - Medical Microbiology
  - Pharmacological Basis of Therapeutics
- Videos include physical exams, bedside procedures, etc.

#### Anatomy.TV

- Provides interactive 3-D modeling of anatomical structures.
- Can download images for use in presentations, including anatomy slides, clinical slides, dissection slides, and MRI images.


#### ClinicalKey

- A collection of over full-text clinical books, plus journals, drug information, practice guidelines, and images.
- *Books Include:*
  - Netter’s Atlas of Human Anatomy
  - Gordis’ Epidemiology
  - Infectious Diseases
  - Robbins and Cotran Pathologic Basis of Disease
  - Nelson’s Textbook of Pediatrics
- Procedures Consult section contains 300+ overviews of medical and surgical procedures, including videos and illustrations.

### ODIN (Library Catalog)

- Use to search for print books held in the library (Reference and Reserves Collections)

### PubMed

- The main database for searching articles related to ***clinical medicine*** and ***biomedical research***.
- Comprises more than 26 million citations from approximately 5,600 indexed journals indexed.
- Use the  button to check for full-text of article. You will need to change the display “Format” to Abstract to see the UND buttons.

### RefWorks

- Use to store citations, copies of articles, formatting the body of your scholarly papers, formatting bibliographies.
